

SECRET COMPARTMENT RECOGNITION EDUCATION

This 16-hour tuition-free Multijurisdictional Counterdrug Task Force Training course provides students with the crucial knowledge to make informed, effective, and coordinated commercial vehicle searches for the purpose of detecting hidden compartments used to transport illegal narcotics and related contraband. Students learn the role that commercial vehicles play in smuggling throughout the country, as well as the techniques and strategies to find these hidden compartments during traffic encounters. This 2-day option provides photo and video walk-throughs that can be delivered at any location.

Course Topics Include:

- Introduction to drug trafficking using CMV
- Legal aspects of traffic stops
- Comparison of CMV vs. passenger vehicles
- Probable cause and common traffic violations
- Driver and vehicle documentation
- Intelligence
- Safety issues
- Common concealment areas

Instructor Joe Keil is retired from the patrol division as a K9 handler for the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Department, Wisconsin and holds a Bachelor's of Science Degree from Mount Scenario College. Deputy Keil has been a law enforcement officer for 27 years and specializes in criminal patrol having seized over \$1,000,000 in cash, controlled substances, and vehicle seizures from various cases. He has received extensive training through the Drug Evaluation and Classification Program Sponsored by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration certifying him as a Drug Recognition Expert and a Drug Recognition Expert Instructor. He was an instructor for the DRE Certification program at the Maricopa County Jail in Phoenix and has taught at the Wisconsin Jail Officers annual conference for several years. Deputy Keil has written numerous newspaper and magazine articles on drug related issues including drug trends, physiology of the human body and substance abuse, K9s and their usage during traffic stops. Deputy Keil is also a published author of "When Just Say No Doesn't Work", and "Operation R.U.S.H." He has trained thousands of law enforcement officers across the United States and has been a keynote speaker at numerous conferences.

Instructor Christopher Martin is currently serving as the Deputy Chief of the Brewer Police Department in Brewer, Maine. Mr. Martin has been in law enforcement since 1993 and served with the Brewer Police Department since 1994. Prior to his current position, he was patrol Lieutenant and responsible for the general management and supervision of 15 uniformed officers including two drug detection K-9 teams, two school resource officers, two liaison resource officers for public housing, and the department's uniformed drug interdiction programs. During his tenure, Mr. Martin has implemented programs in schools and public housing in an effort to combat a growing drug problem. He has specialized in street level drug investigations and has served as investigator and supervisor in cases involving uniformed patrol interdiction, knock and talk, hotel/motel, use of cooperating individuals, controlled purchases, and preparation and execution of search warrants. Mr. Martin has over 400 hours of specialized training in drug investigations. He has instructed for police officers, schools, civic organizations, and community forums. Mr. Martin is a member of the Penobscot County Adult Drug Court Team and the International Law Enforcement Association.
